PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL PLANNING DAY

The PPC had a planning day last month to set some goals for the parish in 2008. The day was based on our Diocesan Pastoral Plan and previous PPC planning days. Our spirituality as Our Lady of Dolours parish was an important part of the day. This spirituality calls us to respond in ways that will bring others to Jesus through parish goals that are achievable and relevant.

Parish Goals for 2008

Gifted by the spirituality of Our Lady of Dolours Parish, our community desires to care for and nurture everyone who comes to our parish in the gentle spirit of Mary.

We hope to foster a community which –

- 1. Builds up the resources of the parish to serve the faith life of all the people we touch.**
- 2. Nurtures and holds those who want to deepen their relationship with each other and with God and provides opportunities for them to enter into these relationships.**
- 3. Is active in dialogue with the wider community as catholic members of that community.**

Commentary

What does the PPC intend by each of the goals?

Goal 1

Our church is still one of the largest and most distinguished buildings in Chatswood and its location in a large, busy CBD, next to shopping centres, on a major road, near transport interchange makes it a regional centre. People come here to worship and for religious services from outside the parish boundaries because they know we are here, or they went to school here, or they are coming here to shop, or see the doctor or to have a coffee with friends. Our first goal is to provide the services for these people. As they move in and out of our parish we want the experience to be fertile ground for their faith. We want to be maternal carers for them: we want to welcome them into our community, carry them in our heart for a while, and allow them to leave nourished and supported in their faith journey. These may be most of the people who come to our parish.

Goal 2

Some people will stay here or keep coming back. For them we want to offer a place to belong, people to be in relationship with, a means to grow in their relationship with God, ways to celebrate and express their faith, and opportunities to grow in knowledge and understanding our catholicity. Only some of the people who attend our church may be looking for this “more” than the parish has to offer.

Goal 3

As a parish we want to be active in the wider community, going beyond the church but living our catholic identity. We want to call those who belong to our parish to reach out to other churches, organisations, movements and groups and to be in dialogue with the committed people in those groups. This is a call to mission that is deeply rooted in the Gospel and in the Spirit of a heart of service and generosity.

Each goal requires parishioners to generously respond to and share their unique giftedness

Parish Groups

The many groups and activities in the parish are involved in some way in all three levels of this vision, but each usually focuses on one particular level. To elaborate further on our three goals for 2008 they have been grouped according to their primary focus.

Ministers of Communion; Discussion group; Bible study; CaFE; Charismatic prayer group; Home rosary; Catechesis of the Good Shepherd; Spiro; Antioch; Retreats; Over 50's group; Social committee; Indonesian Catholic group; Filipino Chaplaincy; Korean Masses; 31 club; Celebrate Love; Family groups;

Goal 3

Legion of Mary; Ecumenism; St Vincent de Paul Society; Social Justice group and the three parish projects; Vinnies van;

Thank you to all those who are involved in these groups and contribute, already, to achieving these goals in the parish.

New activities

We are already achieving wonderful results in each of these goals but to extend them even further some things that might be done in 2008 are:

Goal 1

Introduce the new diocesan ministries of Servers, Readers, Liturgy, and Welcomers; Welcome and nurture those who come to our parish for WYD08; mini-planned giving programme; new counters roster;

Goal 2

Encourage more people to join family groups; Support young parishioners to attend WYD08; CaFE – Getting to know God even better;

Goal 3

Donate blood to the Red Cross as the Catholic Community of Chatswood; be involved in Clean up Australia;

What other things might be added to this list? Please suggest them to a member of the PPC.

PLANNED GIVING

With their gifts of time, talents and financial resources, Our Lady of Dolours parishioners sustain the spiritual and material life of our faith community. Thank you for the care and generosity you have shown over the many years!

Planned Giving is the regular financial contribution by parishioners to the parish by weekly envelopes or monthly credit card deductions. News & Reflections

The passing of a great man of the Church

April 2, 2008 marked the third anniversary of the death of Pope John Paul II. It was an event that stopped the world for a moment as everyone, religious or not, stood in hushed reverence. We thank God for the gift of this extraordinary man, priest, Bishop of Rome. Pope.

Parish link: we remember how our parish hosted the diocesan memorial Mass for John Paul II in 2005.

Candidates for Priesthood

Our diocese has two seminarians: Chris Knapman in third year, and Francis Voon in second year. They live at Murphy House, St Ives, a place of formation of priests.

Parish link: Our parish priest, Vince Casey, was instrumental in establishing Murphy House and continues to guide the seminarian program. Francis Voon was a parishioner at Pennant Hills, Fr Vince's previous parish.

Candidates for Diaconate

On 18 April this month, our diocese will celebrate the ordination of three married deacons. Two of these men have important links with our parish:

David McKenzie grew up here in Chatswood; son of parishioners Viv & Valma, brother of Greg. David currently lives and ministers at The Lakes Parish (Narrabeen/Collaroy).

Roberto Corpuz, a parishioner, worked here for a number of years and currently ministers at Willoughby. Roberto takes a leading role with the monthly Filipino Mass which is held here at Chatswood.

We pray for both candidates for diaconate, their wives and families and communities as they prepare for ordination.

The passing of a great woman of the Church

March 14, 2008 saw the death of Chiara Lubich at age 88. Chiara, the foundress of the Focolare movement, which has been instrumental in forming Christian communities, promoting inter-faith unity, and outreach in the cause of justice.

Chiara began Focolare as a small group of committed laywomen in Italy during World War II. Some of the group's early meetings took place in air raid shelters under American bombardment. She later wrote: "Is there an ideal that does not die, that no bombs can destroy, an ideal we can give our whole selves to? Yes, there is. It is God."

But rather than joining a convent, she focused her devotion on the idea that lay people could also lead full religious lives. At her death, Focolare counted 140,000 core members and more than two million followers in 182 countries.

Parish link: Our parish has members active in the Focolare movement. The "Word of Life" reflections which Chiara started are now available each month in the main church foyer.

Ecclesial Women: Mary Star of the Sea Community

A new community of 'lay ecclesial women' was officially launched last month with four women taking a formal commitment at a ceremony on 31 March at Waitara Cathedral.

The four women are: Sue Beencke, Kathy Moran, Elizabeth Wallace, Joan Pavitt. They made promises (initially for one year) to live a life of celibacy, simplicity and obedience to the Bishop; to assist the Bishop in the pastoral care of the people of Broken Bay Diocese.

Parish link: This initiative of Bishop David Walker was sparked by the approach of Teresa Pirola (our sacraments minister) back in 2005. How so?

Teresa has shared with us previously

how she experienced a 'priestly' calling on 6 August 2000. In 2005, after 5 years of discernment (which led her to us at Chatswood Parish) she approached the bishop with a dream for finding a public diocesan expression of her 'priestly' commitment.

During 2006, Teresa, Fr Vince Casey and Chatswood parishioner Trish Wilson were part of a diocesan committee appointed to explore a new vocational expression for women. Others continued this work, and by 2008 it had become Mary Star of the Sea Community.

As fruitful as this path has been, Teresa does not see the Star of the Sea Community as the appropriate avenue to channel her 'priestly' vocation and happily chooses to continue to 'live the question' about women and ordination in a spirit of fidelity to the Church.

Three other women from our parish were among the first group of 'ecclesial women' enquirers. Although none have chosen to proceed at this time, we can rejoice that their searching steps have also helped in the shaping of this new community of lay ecclesial women.

On Good Shepherd Sunday the Church asks us to pray for priestly vocations

Please continue to pray:

For our bishop, David Walker;

For our priests and deacons;

For our Broken Bay seminarians and candidates for diaconate;

For our priests who face difficult life challenges, who are having time off or who have left active ministry;

That parishioners will discern priestly vocations in their midst and that young men will courageously respond;

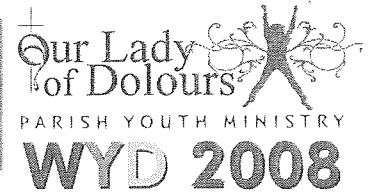
For women who sense within themselves the mission of the ordained. May God lead them and our Church in discerning their call;

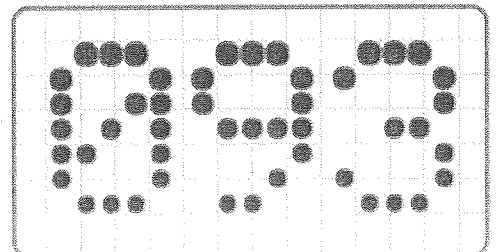

A Stations of the Cross pilgrimage is being constructed in May 2008 around the island with a different station in each of 14 parishes. This will allow pilgrims and visitors to experience a unique way spiritual journey in Tasmania.
