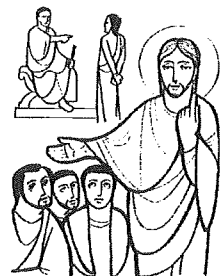

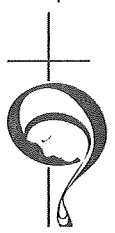

## ***CONSTRUCTION UPDATE***

The **car park in Kirk St** needs some sections of the bitumen to be replaced. This will be done in a day when the surface has been able to dry out. The mechanism controlling the electronic gate also has to be installed. The car park will be available to parishioners for weekend Masses only.

Electrical conduits are about to be installed along **Ferguson Lane**. The work will be done in three stages and will affect access to schools and church from the lane:

1. Outside OLD school from 23 to 26 June. This will be during the day. There will be some excavation. The most noise will be at the beginning when they are breaking the surface.
2. The gate outside Pius overnight on 27 and 28 June and then outside Pius on 27 to 30 June. There will be no parking in the Pius car park at this time. Access to the Pius grounds will be from Archer St.
3. From the corner of Pius to Anderson St on 1 and 2 July. Access to the car park will be from Archer St. Cables will be laid in the conduits on 10 and 11 July.

A.W. Edwards have been approved as the builders of **Civic Place** and a contract will be signed soon. Cardinal will be finishing the demolition before the end of the month and the site will be handed over to Edwards. Edwards will have an office in Anderson St from July. They will be erecting hoarding around the site in August and September. In September and October there will be piling and insertion of rock anchors around the perimeter of the site. A public meeting has been arranged with the representatives of AW Edwards and Willoughby Council on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> July at 7pm in Harrington Hall.

From **Chatswood Chase** we have received information that, starting Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> June at the Malvern Ave Car Park entrance there will be:

- Scaffold erection
- Formwork
- Concreting
- Construction of block wall
- Construction of footpath
- Construction of columns

- Vibrating work
- And at the back of 12-14 Malvern Ave there will be:
- Construction of concrete staircase
  - Reinstate footpath
  - Reinstate fencing
  - Planting of native shrubs

- Drilling, hammering (small tools)
- Possible vibration

- Noise from power tools, excavators

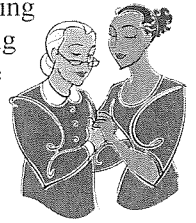

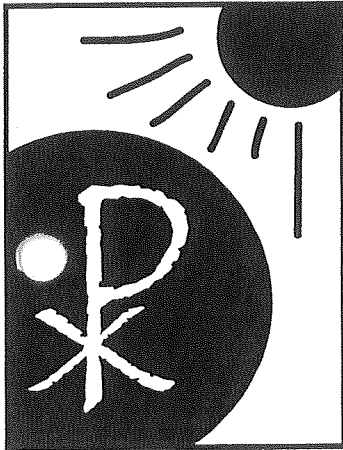

## in a nutshell

To be a disciple of the Lord is no cushy lifestyle. As today's Gospel points out, Christians - like Jesus himself - meet with suffering and persecution. But take heart, for they will not be left defenceless. God cares for his people and will keep them safe in ways that matter most. So, no matter what trials befall us, do not be afraid, trust in God, step out and witness to the truth!

## Witness

*These words were spoken at the funeral of a young woman who died after an extended illness:*

With Betty's death we have a thousand questions in our minds. Why? Why someone so young? Did she not suffer enough? Where is God's presence in these days?

I once saw a film about the hearing child of deaf and dumb parents. One scene in the film shows the girl walking down a street with her father. It is a cloudy day, but suddenly the clouds part and sunlight floods the street. The deaf and dumb man turns to his daughter and signs to her. She smiles and hugs him. He had asked a question: Does God make a noise when he touches our hearts?

In recent days at the Intensive Care Unit, God has been present to us as sunlight touching the ground. No noise, no intrusion, no fuss. A simple, sure, silent presence.

As we all know, Betty was a fighter. But this time she had to surrender. And we had to let her go, we had to surrender her to God. That's very hard.

Remember it was the wounded Betty who so often bound us together. We were brought together by her frailty, as we are today. Betty's life and death are vivid reminders that we are saved not by our strengths but in our frailty.

And what of the power of the Resurrection? The power of the Resurrection is not a magical drug to still the pain of the human condition. It is not the facile cheerfulness of breakfast time TV. It does not carry us around life, but through life. It is the power to enter life's deepest darkness in the certain hope that at the heart of darkness is found a sure, steady, unquenchable light.

Our sister Betty has gone to the light. (FN)

My holiday was made in that one short moment.

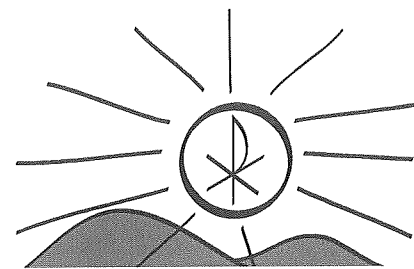

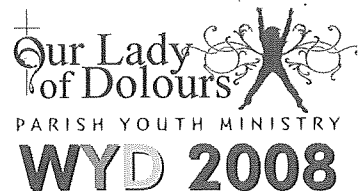

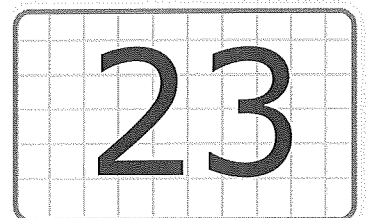
